EVERY ONE HOPE

Every day, men and women from all walks of life face challenges that are unimaginable to those who haven't experienced the cycle of addiction and homelessness. While their stories are each unique, they all need the same essentials: hope, freedom, and the life transformation that comes from a supportive community.

In Canada, it is estimated that approx. 21% of the population will meet the criteria for addiction in their lifetime. Over 3,100 people are homeless in Calgary on any given night.

Over 115,000 people in Calgary, including children, are at risk of homelessness every day.

In Canada, 22 people die every day of overdoses. More of those deaths happen in Alberta than anywhere else.

PROGRAMS

A CONTINUUM OF CARE

CDC provides support to people who are working hard to break free from cycles of addiction, homelessness, and despair. Our programs are designed to support them from when they first join us, through the critical and courageous early stages of making life changes, and then in an ongoing capacity through our alumni community and the power of connection.



Our holistic 90-day recovery program addresses the mind, body, and spirit through a variety of recovery-focused classes, group sessions, physical activity, and personalized support from Case Managers. Classes explore topics such as mindfulness, emotional regulation, distress tolerance, interpersonal effectiveness, and spirituality from a Christian faith-based perspective.

Transformation happens within a compassionate community, where clients experience a sense of belonging, discover hope and freedom, and are empowered to build a meaningful life.



HOUSING SOLUTIONS

A safe and supportive home provides a place for men and women to recover, find stability, and face the challenges of life with confidence. With 49 properties* across communities in Calgary and 371 individuals housed at any time, we are helping people rediscover hope and rebuild their lives as they pursue a life worth living.

Second Harvest Frontline Impact Food Rescue Award

This year the Calgary Dream
Centre won the Second Harvest
Frontline Impact Food Rescue
Award for Alberta. The food
we rescued this year has an
average national retail value of
\$386,579.39, and has diverted
tons of healthy, quality food
from being thrown out. Instead
of being wasted, it provided
more than 106,000 meals to
people in our community.

Wellness Event Highlight

This year we gathered 20 community partners together to host a wellness event for our community members, the general public, and some of the most vulnerable members of our city. Gifts and services such as: hygiene packs, love packs, immunizations, and health screening were practical offerings to help bring hope and support to people who need it.
